Lee Nesbitt reported that there was a presentation on drought conditions with an agriculture viewpoint. Samples of monitoring programs (soil moisture, evapotranspiration rates, drip, etc) by growers were discussed. There was an update on the San Simeon Water District easement dispute. A WRAC seat as alternate behind Eric Greening for the at-large representation was approved.

Nate Page (GSI) reported there is no update since the presentation last meeting. A second SkyTEM round of measurements has taken place, with the data set expected to be released in March 2022. The flight lines for this round do cover some data gaps. Willy Cunha (SSJWD) had asked GSI to hold until March for more work. Jerry Reaugh asked if GSI is funded for the second round of work, and the response was no and that a scope of work was needed.
